Dear Member,

I have pleasure in presenting my 3rd Annual Report on the activities of this Association.

Membership has increased to 141. Thirteen Regional Representatives are appointed, covering 13 counties; Scotland, Wales and the Channel Isles having one Representative each in addition. All organisations promoting major open water Championships are now affiliated.

This has been another outstanding year of progress for the Association, and it has also been a year of remarkable achievements by our members. Further long distance swimming history has been made by Commander C. Gerald Forsberg (R.N.) O.B.E., with his swims in Loch Lomond, Loch Neagh, and the first two way Morecambe Bay swim.

In my last Annual Report I mentioned a new member by the name of Joe Smith, of Rochdale. Comparatively unknown at that time he has indeed worked hard and is now reaping the rewards.

Joyce Bricknell of Coventry, has made a clean sweep of all the major Ladies Championships.

The season opened early, and on the 23rd May, 10 members took part in a trial at Hollingworth Lake. Newcomer Geoffrey Wilson (Halifax) and Joyce Bricknell (Coventry) were selected to represent the Association in the Dutch International Long Distance Championship. Hollingworth Lake lived up to its reputation of being one of the coldest and roughest lakes in the country. Temp. 55-6. Waves up to 2'.

Our two representatives in Holland acquitted themselves with credit against several Olympic Games swimmers, and both apparently enjoyed their weekend visit to the continent. G. Wilson 5th & J. Bricknell 6th in their respective Championships. The members selected for the 1960 Championship could plan a holiday round it. All return tickets are valid for one month.

Torbay Championship. In spite of the excellent arrangements made by our new Torbay Championship Hon. Sec. Mr. E. Robinson (Otley) in conjunction with the Torquay Corporation, Mr. John Robinson, Mr. G. Wheaton, Mrs. S. Margotts, and our other Torquay friends, they could not prevail over the strong offshore wind which suddenly caused the retirement of all competitors. Taking into consideration all the circumstances of the race, including the position and condition of the swimmers both at the turn at Brixham and when ordered from the water, the Emergency committee unanimously decided to award the Men's Championship to Wm. Thrall (Rotherham) and the Ladies Championship to Joyce Bricknell (Coventry). This decision was subsequently confirmed at the next Executive meeting, and it was pointed out that the decision to alter the course to Torquay to Brixham, was in accordance with the Championship rules. Certificates were awarded to all who completed the one way crossing, or finished within a line drawn parallel to the Brixham shore, off the breakwater. The certificates to be amended by a printed slip indicating that the Championship course was altered. Members who completed the one way crossing were Wm. Thrall 2.6 $\frac{1}{2}$, G. Wilson. 2.7 $\frac{1}{2}$, B. Watson. 2.14, J. Smith 2.16, R. McCaughey, A. Ayres, J. Somerfield, G. Foote, K. Mellor, G. Smith, C. R. May, A. Endersby, E. A. Hunt, A. Smith, G. Beaton. Ladies; - J. Bricknell 2.27, M. McCarthy, J. Adams. Temp. 60-3. Wind light increasing to fresh, offshore, causing waves 2' - 4'. The customary generous reception was kindly provided by the Torquay Corporation.

The Windermere Championship, under our new Hon. Sec. Mr. J. Brown (Morecambe) again was a tremendous success. All our old friends and many new ones, gathered round to help us again. Mr. & Mrs. B. Gooch at the Waterhead Hotel, and Mrs. E. P. Tyson, at the Wateredge Hotel, once more placed their immaculate bathrooms at our greasy disposal. A most important contribution. The Officers & Coasts from Wray Castle, and the local lads once more gave us their services at the oars. Temp. 61-4. Wind negligible in the 1st half, light but opposing in the 2nd half, resulting in slower times than had been expected. It now seems obvious that the lightest opposing wind will spoil the chance of record times and will cause the retirement of swimmers who otherwise would succeed. This was an exciting and interesting race right up to the last half mile. From the start, 4 swimmers took an early lead, with not more than 100 yards between them for the

Bath Oldham, (Grange over Sands) 17 years, rounded off the season for Windermere in 3.22. Our Bradford members are now neck and neck with Coventry, but are still some way behind Rotherham in the inter town Windermere swimmers unofficial contest. Neither Bradford or Coventry have yet produced a Channel swimmer, compared with two from Rotherham. I wonder who will be the first. It is requested that all members notify the Hon. Soc. before making any attempt on Windermere, and also, if the attempt is successful, make written application for recognition and a certificate stating precise starting and finishing point, exact time taken and enclosing a certificate from the official B.L.D.S.A. observer.

Withernsea Mile. (unconfirmed) Dorothy Perkins (Bradford) retained her title.

Two-way Morecambe Bay Once again Commander Forsberg sets up a new swimming record. Not so long ago, local fishermen said it was impossible for a swimmer to walk in at Grange and walk out at Morecambe, but now we have them walking in at Morecambe, out at Grange, having a chat with local civic dignitaries and swimming back again. C.G.F.'s time was 6.23. It was local girl, Ann Johnston (Grange over Sands) former Cross Bay Champion, 17 years, who became the first woman to complete this new swim. Coached

Mr. Roland Kershaw, Grange over Sands Baths Supt., time 6.25. After being taken off course in the Cross Bay Championship earlier in the month, our Assistant Hon. Sec. Kendall Meller (Keighley) made a determined swim, and although not having the advantage of previously swimming the Bay, he completed the two way journey in a new record time of 5.19. In all two-way attempts, the time is taken from leaving point 'A' until returning to point 'A' and includes any stop for "char & wads" or time on land at the turning point.

Windermere Cross Lake Championship. This popular (just less than a mile) pre-war swim has been revived under the auspices of the Windermere S.C. Championship Hon. Sec. being none other than Derek Hewitson, our enthusiastic local member who has assisted at all our Windermere Championships, many successful individual attempts, and the two Ullswater swims, as well as Loch Lomond. Winner of the Ladies Championship - Joyce Bricknell. 25 mins.

Morecambe Cross Bay Championship. J.Smith. 2.32. J.Bricknell 2.38.

Morecambe Inshore Swim Championship. J.Smith 1.1. J.Bricknell 1.5. A very successful weekend for these two young swimmers.

Douglas Way Championship. (unconfirmed) The winner was not a member of the B.L.D.S.A. Ladies Champion - J.Bricknell.

F de Firth Championship. The winner was not a member of the B.L.D.S.A. (unconfirmed)

Obituary. During the season it was with deep regret that we heard of the death of one of our members. Mr. Sam Unwin of Keighley, a founder member, former town Councillor, connected with swimming and youth work in the town for many years. Mr. Charles Daly, of Manchester, the foremost amateur long distance swimmer of his day. Former Morecambe Bay Champion and Windermere record holder from 1934 - 1955. Daly attended the Hollingworth Lake trial and we were looking forward to seeing him at the Windermere Championship. Our sincere sympathies are extended to Mrs. Unwin & Keith, and to Mrs. Daly & family.

Will the member who borrowed my two books, "It's Cold in the Channel" by Sam Rockett. and "Long Distance Swimming" by C.G.Forsberg, nearly two years ago, kindly let me know if he has read them yet. As reference books and for sentimental value I should be glad to have them back.

Training Demonstration was again held at Morecambe and attended by many of our competitive members. Thro' the good offices of our Reg. Rep. Mr. J.Brown, free training facilities are available to members at the Morecambe Stadium, only on the production of membership cards. This facility does not include free admittance of wives, children and friends.

Lough Neagh, previously unswum, was conquered by Commander Forsberg, 20 miles in 13.12. Another record for the book. The first time that the Association has been represented in Irish waters. There only remains the Irish Channel for the Commander, who will then have completed all the longest recognised swims in Great Britain. The Association has approved the recognition of this swim by the award of a certificate.

Jason Ziganos, of Greece, whilst not a member of the Association for obvious reasons, was an outstanding marathoner known to several of our members. Windermere Swimmer Channel Swimmer etc., we were grieved to hear of his tragic death whilst attempting the Irish Channel.

Windermere H.Q. The Albert Hotel. Mr. Jack Couplethwaite, who has assisted the Association and individual members on many occasions is to retire from The Albert. His enthusiastic assistance and encouragement have in many ways been responsible for the success of our Windermere Championships and we have always been assured of a friendly welcome. Jack has other business interests in the district and will be remaining at his present address. We shall look forward to seeing him at the Championships for many years to come, and now, having a little more time on his hands we might even persuade him to enter the 1960 Championship.

I should be glad if members would let me have details preferably newspaper reports, (corrected if necessary) of any individual long distance swimming activities reported in their local press. Useful as well as interesting information on potential long distance swims and swimmers sometimes comes to light in this manner. All material and photos received in this connection are available for inspection at our Annual Dinner or at Championship meetings.

Each year since the Association's inception in 1956, we have brought a new Championship into being. Obviously this cannot continue indefinitely, and the short summer programme is now fairly well made up. There is only one addition that we must have in due course, and that is an International Championship, possibly in Lake Windermere. The item is on the agenda at the A.G.M. and no doubt we shall have a full expression of views.

On behalf of the Executive I extend my sincere thanks to all members who have supported and assisted our various activities during the season.
